





HANDSPRING PUPPET CO.

WOYZECK ON THE HIGHVELD (U.S. PREMIERE)

This daring and moving interpretation of Büchner's classic play skillfully combines actors, puppets, music and animation to create a uniquely rich and multidimensional whole. Conceived and directed by filmmaker William Kentridge, the action is transposed from 19th-century Germany to a highveld township of Johannesburg. One critic called this Handspring Puppet Company production "a fantastic, stylistic work that simply shatters all standards."




HANNE TIERNEY

Representing Stein's characters (a man who looks like Dashiell Hammett, a woman who looks like Lady Diana Grey) with an ingenious assortment of tafetta fabrics and industrial materials, Tierney captures the elegant superficiality and purposeless movement that inspire this classic Stein play.




KIYOHIME MANDARA (U.S. PREMIERE)








SUZY FERRISS


SOLITUDE
