This year's roster features twentytwo productions from around the globe, ranging from startling adaptations of Brecht, Jarry and Melville to inventions of a fantastical and original nature. To accommodate this year's epic gathering of masks, marionettes, shadows, rod puppets and found objects, the Festival has expanded to performances in nine theaters at five venues: the Public Theater, La Mama E.T.C., Dance Theater Workshop, P.S. 122 and the New Victory Theater. 

THE BAROQUE OPERA

Within a perfect miniature of a classic opera stage, this charming 18th-century folk opera unfolds. A story about some bungling masons, whose newly built chimney crumbles and falls, it is a poetical, philosophical and deviously polemical commentary on life in the pre- and post- Soviet East Bloc from the sons of renowned filmmaker Milos Forman. This production features classical marionettes, their puppet animals and tiny props, as well as an inspired score by contemporary Czech composer, Vitezslav Janda.





Frantisek Vitek and Vera Ricarova are a husband and wife team that were once part of the worldfamous Theatre Drak; he as a gifted and renowned wood carver, she as one of their most talented performers. They describe this production as "an antitheater installation piece about the metaphysics of movement." With an assemblage of simple, wooden puppets, found objects, and mechanical musical instruments, they explore the line between life and its absence, creating a tender and poetic tribute to the power of non-verbal communication.

EVIDENCE OF FLOODS

Evidence of Floods is a walk-through diorama-performance in eight scenes using puppets, actors, and miniature sets to create a harrowing journey through the real-life nightmare of a woman fleeing her abuser. The work quotes slyly from a classic film noir, with viewers invited to peep voyeuristically through windows and cracks in the ceiling as they follow a woman who flees her husband, disguises herself as a private investigator and is hired to look for herself. 

This is a riveting production from one of the most creative contemporary theater groups in Argentina best known for dark, cutting-edge productions. This production features turn of the century china dolls abandoned by children of the upper-class. The title of this deeply disturbing play refers to an observation room, made of one way glass, from which a person's behavior can be secretly observed. From this vantage point the audience watches as a young boy's stormy relationships, despair and solitude, lead to acts of cruelty, repression and finally murder.

TWIN HOUSES

The Guardian of London called this "a very startling piece of visual theatre: eerie, sinister, erotic, like a cross between the Gothic horror of Edgar Allan Poe and the imagistic strangeness of Belgian surrealism." Conceived and performed by Nicole Mossoux and directed by Patrick Bonté, the piece is a dark and disturbing study of a fragmented psyche for one performer and five life-size mannequins. Paris's Le Soir called this production "intensely magical."






PUPPET LOUNGE AT P.S. 122 **LATE NIGHT**



PUPPETS & PERFORMING OBJECTS IN THE 20TH CENTURY THE NEW YORK PUBLIC LIBRARY FOR THE PERFORMING ARTS AT LINCOLN CENTER JUNE 12 - SEPTEMBER 28, 1996

Exactly one hundred years ago, the course of modern theater was changed when Alfred Jarry's Ubu Roi brought the world of puppets, masks and other performing objects onto the centerstage of Western theater. This exhibition unites examples of the object in performance by artists approaching the work from theater, the visual arts, dance and performance art, broadcast and projected media and new technologies. The work will range from various productions of *Ubu* to high-tech experiments, including such varied artists as Pablo Picasso, Alexandra Exter, Bauhaus artist Lothar Schrever and Bil Baird.
